The Outreach Committee voted unanimously to suspend, for the duration of the shutdown or until the end of 2020, the rule of helping a family or an individual only once during a 12-month period. The Committee also voted unanimously, for the duration of the shutdown or until the end of 2020, to consider helping people who live off the Island but have lost a job on the Island. At the appropriate time, the Committee will re-vote on these articles. The Winn Dixie cards we are using were a gift from Tom and Marie Johnson of St. James City. They generously gave Outreach \$500.00 in cards for use at our discretion. A thank-you note and tax deductible receipt were sent.

Funds will be transferred to cover 2 scholarships each for \$2,000. from PIE account and from Matlacha Mariners funds. This year we will award 10 or 11 scholarships each @ \$2,000.17 qualified applications have been received with more perhaps to come. (postmarked May 1st) b) Merchandise Report: merchandise chairs are looking into new orders of shirts, cups, wine stoppers (omitting food products at this time) They have been budgeted for \$2,900. in 2020 and were reminded that orders above \$1,000. require general membership approval.

- c) Wine Event: Wrap-up meeting notes:
  - The phone and conference call meeting service Go To Meeting worked well, we had over 10 members attend. Meeting was positive and productive!
  - We voted to give the Beacon \$5,000 and hold back \$3,400. for next year.
    We spent a lot of time looking to where we can cut expenses, one of the thoughts is to move the event inside and get the location donated.
  - We would like to propose the next Wine Event is Sunday March 7, 2021 We will be looking to secure a spot once we confirm the date with the Board & then the Chamber
  - We will be meeting again on Monday, May 18th at 6pm to start the other planning items such as a theme to get a jump start on planning for next fall/winter.
  - I have called the Beacon to see when we can meet with them and also incorporate their ideas into the next planning cycle.
