BAG N TAG REPORT MARCH 02, 2020

- Street signs were an improvement over 2019. More, larger, bolder signs helped.
- There was signage nearer the Moose Lodge this year and a banner at the 4-way stop. Signs are needed at the Moose entrance, front door and side door.
- Flyers were distributed to 25 locations around the Island. At least half of them should have been in Spanish as well as English.
- The first two articles in the Pine Island Eagle were very good. The third was a disappointment in that the info printed was not that submitted.
- Having a clear cut off date for donations was an asset. Traders Hitching Post and Century 21 were most helpful in being drop off sites for merchandise.
- Sign-up sheets for sorting days and for shifts at the sale, plus bake sale, boutique, set-up and take-down were utilized and useful.
- Four sorting sessions were needed.
- One new Hooker asked for and received permission to market her wares with the proviso that she donate 25% to the Hookers. This was a one-time pilot program only.
- As many worker cars as possible were moved away from the sale area. This was important as a bus trip leaving from the Moose occurred on the same day.
- Most of the tables borrowed from Chamber, PICC, the Hooker trailer, etc. were clearly marked with the lender's name. It made returning them much easier.
- We used approximately 50 six foot long tables plus 2 ground tarps.
- We had adequate "STAFF" name tags and lists of "Instructions for workers" and those were appreciated by the helpers.
- GED students helping with set up in exchange for breakfast and Boy Scouts helping to take down to earn badges were invaluable.
- The Bake Sale did less well than last year. Leftover cookies were donated for the Beacon Bites program.
- The Boutique tent was well organized and clothing attractively displayed. The round clothing rack loaned by PICC was very useful and should be borrowed again if possible.
- Breakfast was a success with homemade cinnamon buns making a popular debut. More than breakfasts were served.
- Leftover merchandise was transported to PICC.
- Sales figures: Pre-sale, merchandise, bake sale, boutique, tips: \$2267. Breakfast/tips: \$ for total proceeds of: Subtracting 15% () for the General Fund leaves a net of \$. All participants worked very hard and their efforts were appreciated and worthwhile.
- A great deal of hard work was expended by a few for the return of just one scholarship.
- This event takes place at the height of Season, at a time when everyone is busiest and it comes on the heels of several other fundraisers, including rummage sales held by other groups. Would it make any sense to move Bag n' Tag to early April??
